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About This Game

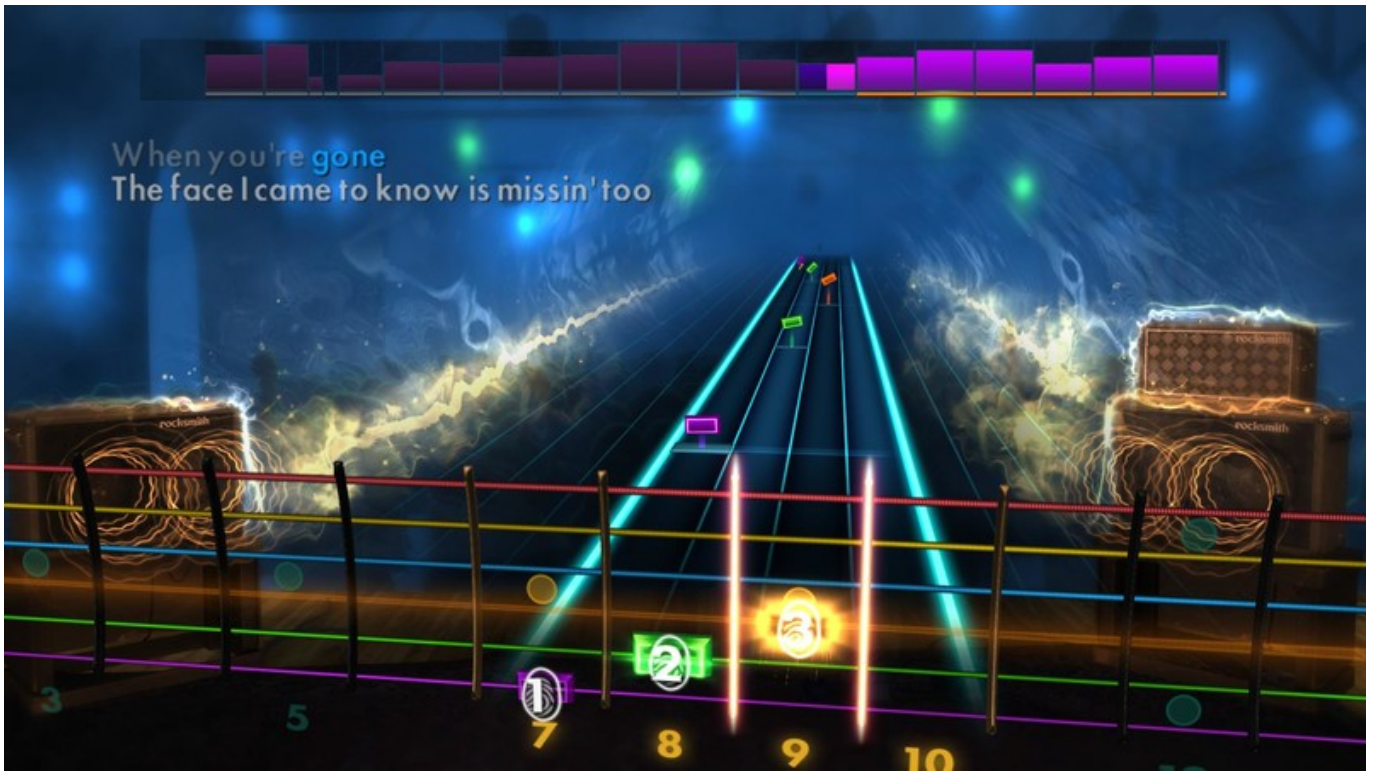

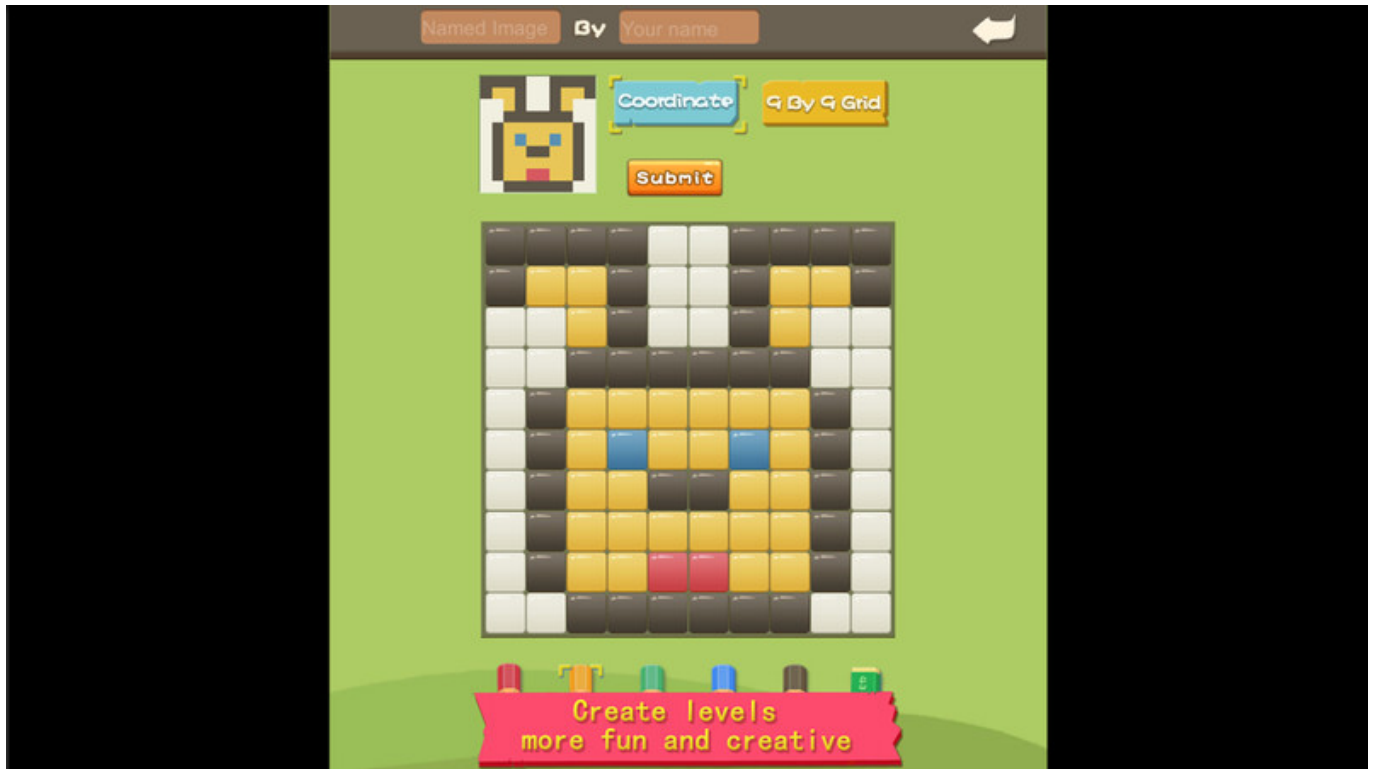

The fighting system is original and clever. Having the enemies's and your partners' actions wheels always cycling and not being able to use the same action twice (until you've used all actions in your wheel) forces you to think ahead. The management of abilities, money, health and relationships between fights is a fun challenge, without being overwhelmingly complicated.

The game does get repetitive quite fast, so it's really a game to be played in short sessions.

Lots of mechanics really foster the feeling of maintaining and being in a relationship. For example, once you have grown close enough to a partner, you can be in-sync with them (having both of your action wheels turn together). Another example is the choices you have to make: there are branching paths, and there are two different actions you can choose to do at the end of fights. Each has their pros and cons, and the player may have their idea of what is the best action to make, but your partner(s) will choose something first. If you decide to go with them, your relationship grows stronger (which has the in-game purpose of eventually making them "level up" and gain more health); if you don't your relationship grows weaker, eventually leading to a break up.

To me, such details reinforce the idea of having a relationship that evolves and that you have to take care of. All of this makes Roguenance a game about love without having dialogues or being (too) explicit about it <3. Even though I recommend the game for the table tennis component, the tennis gameplay is making me not recommend this. After upgrading my PC, I was excited to finally play more than the table tennis practice area as everything else was too laggy to play.

With the purchase of a GTX 1070, the table tennis league mode was able to be played smoothly, but tennis is still too laggy that you can't hit the ball accurately: play the game. I don't know if the game is optimised well or not, but other games with better graphics could run smoothly before my PC upgrade. It's quite a shame because I was really looking forward to the other 50% of content this game has to offer.

Note: Performance (prior to my upgrade) was better through Steam (purchased) than the Vive application (Viveport Subscription).. A Stroke of Fate: Operation Valkyrie is a typical point-and-click adventure containing dry, emotionless, and uninspiring voice actors. They really should have done the game in German with English subtitles or at least cast actors with German accents. But even then, when you supply actors with no personality, it wouldn't have mattered much.

The story takes place after the failed attempt of the original Operation Valkyrie and you play the role of an SS Officer with a secret desire to carry on the mission. Many of the clickable objects provide a mini 1940s German history lesson. It's slightly interesting, but the storytelling is pretty bland making this a boring experience overall.. This game is a complete trainwreck that does everything wrong. It controls poorly, has bad graphics for 2010, terrible music, horrible voice acting, lousy gunplay, and floaty vehicle physics. If you want a hunting game that will provide any semblance of realism don't even bother. Try "theHunter: Call of the Wild" instead. The reason that I recommend this game is because it is hilariously bad. I have had around 70 minutes worths of laughs out of this game spanning the year or so I have owned it and I'm sure it will provide more the longer I own it. It is the one game that I can honestly say makes me laugh just downloading it despite having downloaded it 6 or 7 times before. If it is on sale for around \$1.50 I'd say pick it up as it is well worth that price.. This is actually really fun. I completed the game when my net was down, but it didn't take me more than a couple of hours. It's best described, in my eyes, as a B-Rated experience. Like Birdemic, or Sharknado. It's not terrible, but it's just so very... weird. It's still fun and enjoyable though, and if you want something silly and cheesy i'd very much reccomend it. Pros:

- ++ It's a dating sim.
- ++ That "Sinful Eden Girl" is a massage lady, and gives you a boner.
- ++ Priestess Aurore's "scary" form on the game over screen is pretty sexy.

Cons:

- You have to remember phone numbers
- Game asks you trivia questions to make most of your money. (IE: Math problems, what is an echidna, etc.)
- The "eye of ra" states it says there's hidden items. But doesn't say HOW TO FIND THEM IF IT IS BLINKING/GLOWING.
- Game has no "Exit to Title" option on the diary so that you can re-read the instructions.
- Game has no real instructions for anything. Just how to do things in the game like accrue Reputation and money, but that's it, no advanced insructions like HOW TO USE THE EYE OF RA.
- Repetitive Music

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- The character is always toting his "Shocked" Expression. The game even makes fun of it.
 - Only 5 girls. (1 Hidden)
 - The Goddess Board Mini game can \u2665\u2665\u2665 off.
 - You have to max out relationships with all the non-hidden girls before you can actually progress.
 - You can't romance the Massage Lady (the Sinful Eden Girl at the title.)

Two, the tutorial is laughable. Tutorials are supposed to explain how the game works, not just go over the HUD and then end. I can't figure out the controls, even if I could save the game. Which I can't. I spent ten minutes clicking on things in the combat screen, trying to get something to happen -- then gave up.

Do not waste your time on this game until the developers put in a save/load function and a tutorial that includes how to play the game instead of just explaining what you're looking at. When and if they do that, grab it.. Green coochie-cutters are never in season, Rick.

I'd like to think that Fox n Forests is the result of Zootopia's economic structure completely collapsing and the idea of electing honey badger Trump didn't work as well as everyone planned causing Nick Wilde to become a thief that dresses like a tramp.

In Fox n Forests, you play as Rick the Fox, not to be confused with Nick the Wilde, as you embark on a journey to save the forest and the Great Season Tree. Although this is a solo journey, you will be accompanied, sort of, by a wise-cracking, Kentucky Fried pigeon named Patty. Aside from being the comic relief, she is also responsible for running the various shops as well as flying you to certain destinations on occasion. Changing the seasons is so much fun and you even get a different music track that plays for each respective season. The character animations are really fluid and enjoyable to watch and I hope you like puns because this game is punny AF. Standard stages and boss battles are challenging and fun to play. Don't you dare ask for a hint when the boss of each respective stage wrecks you! This game is a 16-bit symphony of colorful stages and great music. The game boasts eight stages, four boss battles, and four hidden-ish bonus stages to play. There are collectables in the game like seeds, stone wheels(?), and crystals to collect and with RPG-like mechanics implemented; you'll be at this game for hours trying to level up and find every little Knick-Knack in order to 100% the game. Even though I can't get enough of this game; I don't think that everyone will gravitate to it as I did.

Enemy placement is vigorous and combining this with some of the level designs are downright diabolical. Also, you need to collect a certain amount of seeds in order to plant new trees(progress to different seasons) and that's a bit of a downer. Another pace-breaker happens when you're beaten by a stage boss. For some reason, you're placed back at the map screen and when you play the stage again you're forced to skip the dialogue in order to try again. IT WAS ANNOYING! The biggest sin this game has is Rick himself. If you are not grind happy or if you are not enfatuated with having your balls kicked on a regular basis, you may want to steer clear of this game. Rick's moveset is\u2665\u2665\u2665\u2665\u2665\u2665poor at the start and he feels as stiff as a corpse until you start buying his abilities. So either you grind level one and other stages for a while to make Rick feel more fluid or you recklessly say goodbye to your virginity because this game is pretty \u2665\u2665\u2665\u2665ing hard. I have NO desire to play a new again because I don't want to deal with stiff as a board, Rick, and that's kinda bad. There could be a new game plus option that allows me to put this guy in a mankini and I'd still pass...it's THAT bad. To clarify, just a little, \u2019d gladly replay on a clear save file as opposed to starting over.

Is it worth \$10(I paid \$8)? I honestly think that you should grind it out a bit at level one so you can play it because besides that little flub I totally recommend this game. I bought it twice.
